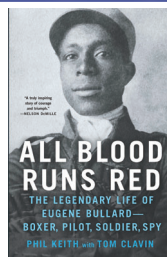

All Blood Runs Red Phil Keith with Tom Clavin

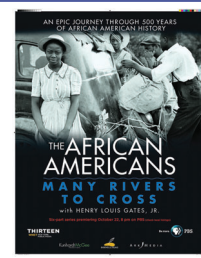
