## OCTOBER'S SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES

### Senior ROK-U.S. Defense Officials Discuss Alliance Issues

U.S. and South Korean defense chiefs discussed the full range of issues confronting the alliance during two days of talks in Seoul, Oct. 27-28. Defense Secretary Jim Mattis and Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Gen. Joe Dunford met with their counterparts, ROK Minister of National Defense Song Young-moo and ROK Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Gen. Jeong Kyeong-doo during the annual Military Committee Meeting and Security Consultative Meeting.

The meetings, that come in the shadow of North Korea's continuing nuclear program and following launches of its intercontinental ballistic missiles, are an annual opportunity for leaders to discuss issues the U.S.-South Korea alliance faces and assess how well the issues are being dealt with. The meetings also provide both countries the opportunity to plan and look ahead and set milestones.

"Diplomacy remains our preferred course of action, but as I have repeatedly emphasized, our diplomats are most effective when backed by credible military force in this sort of situation," Secretary Mattis said. "Make no mistake: Any attempt on the United States or our allies will be defeated," he added.

### USFK Conducts Annual COURAGEOUS CHANNEL Exercise

In cooperation with the ROK Ministry of National Defense and U.S. Department of State, USFK conducted its annual COURAGEOUS CHANNEL exercise, 23-27 October, as part of its routinely-scheduled training.

The exercise maintains readiness by preparing service members and their families to respond to a wide range of crisis management events such as non-combatant evacuation and natural or man-made disasters.

Participants performed tasks that included readiness briefings, document and passport inspection, roster updates, and limited rehearsals. This year's relatively small scale and internal focus, with little to no disruption of daily activities on and around military installations, was consistent with past years' iterations.

"Although not directly tied to current geopolitical events, our forces must be ready in all areas, to include systems and personnel annually exercised in COURAGEOUS CHANNEL," said USFK Commander Gen. Vincent K. Brooks. "This training is as important to readiness as our other routine events such as tank gunnery and fighter wing exercises."
