SUBJECT: United States Forces Korea (USFK) Command Policy Letter #7, Travel Prohibition to North Korea

- 1. All USFK Service Members, DoD Civilians, USFK invited contractors and technical representatives, and their dependents.
- 2. On 14 March 2013, the Department of State warned U.S. citizens against entering North Korea (NK) without explicit official permission. The NK government will prosecute and sentence those who enter NK without proper documentation.
- 3. To enhance the force protection and ensure the safety of its personnel, USFK prohibits Service Members, DoD Civilians, USFK invited contractors and technical representatives, and all USFK dependents from entering NK, regardless of their nationality or whether they are covered under the Status of Forces Agreement. The only exception to this policy is official duty travel specifically sponsored by USFK.
- 4. This is a punitive policy. Persons subject to the UCMJ who fail to comply with this policy are subject to punishment under the UCMJ, as well as adverse administrative action and other adverse action authorized by applicable laws or regulations. Persons not subject to the UCMJ who fail to comply with this policy may be subject to adverse administrative sanctions, including, but not limited to, revocation of privileges as authorized by applicable laws and regulations.
- 5. This policy remains in effect until rescinded or superseded.
