JUNE'S SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES UNC/CFC/USFK Commander meets South Korean President Park Geun-hye (June 15)

President Park congratulated Gen. Vincent K. Brooks on his appointment and asked that he work closely with commanders of the ROK Armed Forces to further solidify the ROK-U.S. Alliance. She emphasized that Korea and the United States should continue to deepen policy coordination and maintain the unequivocal principle of prioritizing North Korea's denuclearization.

General Brooks stated that the threat from the North should never be underestimated, and that he would support

President Park's North Korea policy by strengthening cooperation within the Combined Forces Command, and with his Korean counterparts.

President Park said she hoped that Korean and American soldiers would form a great team with strong camaraderie, maintaining the two countries' robust and combined readiness, so that the Korean public would have a firm sense of security.

UNC conducts Armistice enforcement operations in the Han River Estuary (June 10)

Gen. Vincent K. Brooks, Commander, United Nations Command, in accordance with his responsibilities under the Armistice Agreement, authorized a UNC operation to secure the Han River Estuary from the unauthorized entry of fishermen into a military controlled area, beginning June 10.

The operation was executed by Republic of Korea forces (the Republic of Korea is a member of UNC), and was monitored by members of the UNC Military Armistice Commission.

USS *Mississippi* arrives in South Korea (June 13)

The USS *Mississippi* Virginia-class attack submarine arrived at Busan on June 13, as part of its maiden voyage. The visit allowed the sub's 141 sailors a chance to contact loved ones at home and visit Korea after several weeks at sea.

The Pearl Harbor-based *Mississippi*, one of the most advanced submarines in the world, is equipped with torpedoes and Tomahawk cruise missiles. Commissioned in 2012, it's more than 360-feetlong and displaces about 7,000 tons.

The submarine engaged in a joint exercise with South Korean forces while in the region. "The *Mississippi's* visit is essential to the strengthening and broadening of the U.S. and Republic
