Col. W. Scott Angerman is the Commander, 50th Network Operations Group, 50th Space Wing, Schriever Air Force Base, Colorado. As commander, he is responsible for 1,000 active-duty military, Department of Defense civilian and contractor personnel.

The group provides assured access to space and cyberspace through the \$6.2 billion Air Force Satellite Control Network while providing critical information to the nation's warfighters through the Global Broadcast Service. The group plans, programs, integrates, operates and maintains command and control and common-user systems in support of U. S. Strategic Command, United States Air Force Warfare Center, Missile Defense Agency, 21st, 50th and 310th Space Wings' missions. Additionally, the group is responsible for base communications and the \$100 million Communications and Information gateway.



Angerman was commissioned through the U.S. Air Force Academy, Colorado Springs, Colorado in 1995. He is a master cyberspace operations officer and space professional with assignments in communications, command and control, systems integration, space operations, and joint targeting. He has commanded both communications and space operations squadrons. In addition to many operational and staff assignments, Colonel Angerman has deployed in support of the Balkan Combined Air Operations Center and Enduring Freedom missions along the Pakistan-Afghanistan border.
