Summary. This regulation outlines the roles and responsibilities of weather units to provide Meteorology and Oceanography (METOC) support to United States Forces Korea (USFK) and USFK Service Components. Specific responsibilities are contained in weather support documents of individual weather units supporting USFK.

Summary of Change. This document has been updated to reflect changes in METOC support to USFK due to organizational changes that have occurred since the previous version of this document. A full review of its contents is required.

Applicability. This regulation applies to USFK HQ, USFK Service Components, subordinate organizations, and all weather units supporting USFK in the Korean Theater of Operations (KTO).

Supplementation. Issue of further supplements to this regulation by subordinate commands is prohibited unless prior approval is obtained from USFK J2, FKJ2-SWO, Department of the Air Force, 607 CWS, Unit #15173, APO AP 96271, <u>usaf.humphreys.607-asog.mbx.607-ws-usfk-staff-wx-ops@mail.mil</u>, DSN 315-755-4220.

Records Management. Records created as a result of processes prescribed by this regulation must be identified, maintained, and disposed of according to the governing service regulation. Chapter 1 Introduction

1-1. Purpose

To establish requirements and responsibilities for protecting military resources from adverse weather conditions. This regulation outlines the roles and responsibilities of weather units to provide Meteorology and Oceanography (METOC) support to United States Forces Korea (USFK) and USFK Service Components.

1-3. Explanation of Abbreviations

Abbreviations used in this regulation are explained in the glossary.

Chapter 2 Responsibilities

2-1. Seventh Air Force (7AF) Weather Units

- a. 7AF/Operations & Plans Directorate Weather (7AF/A3OW).
 - (1) Provides staff weather support to Headquarter (HQ) 7AF IAW 7AFI 15-101.
- (2) Oversees weather support requirements for Collocated Operating Bases at Suwon Air Base (AB), Cheong-Ju AB, Gwang-Ju AB, Daegu AB, and Gimhae AB.
 - (3) Plans and coordinates armistice weather support requirements for 7AF HQ.
 - b. The 607th Combat Weather Squadron (607 CWS):
- (1) The Pacific Air Forces (PACAF), through 7AF, resources the 607th Weather Combat Squadron (607 CWS) to provide weather support to HQ USFK.

- (2) The USFK Commander designates the 607CWS/CC as the Joint METOC Officer (JMO) and the FKJ2-SWO with functions executed under the guidance and direction of the USFK J2 and in accordance with (IAW) JP 3-59.
- (3) Provides armistice, exercise, crisis, and wartime support to USFK and Combined Forces Command (CFC) IAW the references listed above.
- (4) Identifies and coordinates U.S. requirements for combined METOC support, to include liaison to the combined METOC coordination cell.
- (5) Coordinates theater weather support requirements with the 17th Operational Weather Squadron (17 OWS), Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, Hawaii, and ensures 17 OWS products and services meet theater needs.
- (6) Provides dedicated weather teams to provide armistice, exercise, crisis, wartime observing, flight weather briefing, forecasting, and staff briefing support to Eighth Army (8A) units, IAW AR 115-10/AFJI 15-157(IP), and USFK Regulation 115-1. The 607 CWS supports the following primary 8A units:

- (7) HQ 8A provides administrative and logistical support to Air Force Battlefield Weather Teams supporting Army units IAW AR 115-10/AFJI 15-157.
- c. The 607th Air Operations Center/Combat Operations Division Weather Specialty Team (607AOC/CODW) provides planning and operations weather support to the Korea Air Operations Center (KAOC). 607AOC/CODW plans and coordinates contingency weather support requirements for Air Component Command (ACC) and the Combined Forces Air Component Command (CFACC).

2-2. Commander, US Naval Forces Korea (CNFK) Weather Units

The Pacific Fleet provides, IAW JP 3-59, USPACOMINST 0539.2, COMNAVMETOCCOMINST 3140.1M, and COMPACFLT OPORD 201, Annex H:

- a. METOC support through Seventh Fleet, Fleet Weather Center San Diego, and Joint Typhoon Warning Center.
- b. Oceanographic data (surf forecasts, tidal data, sea states, etc.,) to HQ USFK and 170WS as required.
- c. Forecaster(s) (J00A) or P-coded METOC Officer to augment the Combined METOC Cell during exercises and contingencies. This person can augment physically or virtually as the situation dictates as long as appropriate connectivity is able to be established.

2-3. Marine Forces Korea (MARFOR-K) Weather Units

- a. Fleet Marine Forces Pacific provides, IAW JP 3-59, USPACOMINST 0539.2, NAVOCEANCOMINST 3140.1L, OPLAN Annex H:
- (1) Coordination with MARFOR-K, and USFK IRT Marine Corps METOC support requirements.
- (2) Organic METOC support via I MEF, and III MEF to Marine Forces assign to USFK AOR during exercise, contingency, and major combat operations.
 - b. Battlefield environmental sensing, to assist in the Joint METOC sensing strategy.
- c. USMC METOC LNO to augment the Combined METOC Cell during exercises and contingencies.

2-4. Special Operations Command Korea (SOCKOR) Weather Unit

SOCKOR provides, IAW USSOCOM Manual 525-6, Meteorological and Oceanographic Thresholds for Special Operations Forces (SOF):

- a. Staff weather support to COMSOCKOR.
- b. Plans and coordinates armistice and contingency weather support requirements for SOCKOR, Combined Special Operations Component Command (CSOCC), Special Operations Joint Task Forces (SOJTF), and United Nations Command Special Operations Component (UNCSOC).
- c. Oversees weather support requirements for permanent and rotational Special Operations Force (SOF) elements.
- d. Coordinates theater weather support requirements with the 23rd Special Operations Weather Squadron (23 SOWS), component weather elements within South Korea, and ensures contingency and exercise support requirements are met.

2-5. Additional Unit Responsibilities

- a. 17 OWS, Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam provides meteorological support to all personnel in USFK IAW AFH 15-101, AFMAN 15-129, and PACAFI 15-101.
- b. U.S. military units deploying to the Korean Peninsula requiring weather support should identify requirements through their respective USFK Service Component.
- c. U.S. military weather units should coordinate requests for support through their respective USFK Service Component to the FKJ2-SWO.
