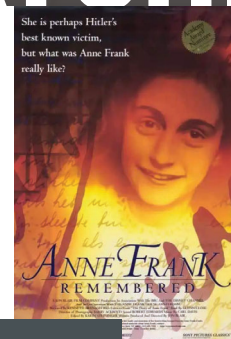

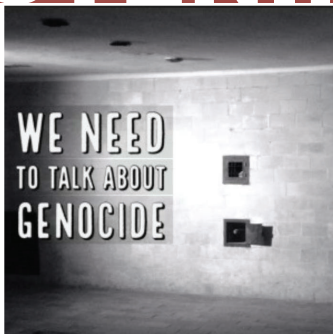
Anne Frank: Remembered
